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<p>History means learning about the past.</p> <p>Long, long ago, humans learnt to communicate by talking to each other.</p> <p>A 'human messenger' was a person who took messages from one person to another. They would often run, or go on a horse.</p> <p>Many years later, humans learnt to write. Messages were written down and taken from one person to another.</p> <p>Sometimes they used pigeons to deliver these notes. Carrier pigeons are still used today.</p>	<p>People have been sending letters by post for over 500 years ago.</p> <p>The Royal Mail service was first made available to the public by King Charles I on 1635.</p> <p>Royal Mail deliver written messages and parcels from one person to another person.</p> <p>The Royal Mail still exists today.</p>	<p>Alexander Graham Bell was an inventor. He is famous for creating one of the world's most important communication devices—the telephone.</p> <p>The first telephone was invented in 1876, almost 150 years ago.</p> <p>People still use landline telephones.</p>	<p>The first call on a mobile phone was made in 1973.</p> <p>In 1984, the first mobile phones were sold in shops. They were expensive and very big (you had to carry them in a suitcase!)</p> <p>People still use mobile phones. They are now smaller and cheaper.</p>	<p>The Internet connects computers – It allows people to use computers to communicate.</p> <p>The Internet is one of the greatest inventions of the past 100 years.</p> <p>In 1989, Sir Tim Berners-Lee invented the World Wide Web. This is an online library of websites where you can read, learn, play games, watch videos and communicate with other people.</p>	<p>The way humans communicate has changed throughout history (it was different in the past).</p> <p>Humans have invented new ways to communicate with each other.</p> <p>When my teacher was born, the Internet did not exist. It had not been invented yet.</p>
