Impact Report for Last Year 2024 – 25

Whole School sports session	£600	All children in the school had the opportunity to try wheelchair basketball and try a new skill, this also supported the schools work on No Outsiders and the belief that everyone is welcome.
Fencing	£1,078	All Year 5 children completed their level 1 fencing award.

H5 activity day and bus	£625	A fantastic day of team building for some of our PP children, where they got to learn bush craft skills and have a go at canoeing.
KS2 H5 activity days	£3182.30	All KS2 children were given the opportunity to develop OAA skills through the activities on hand. Teamwork and perseverance were also developed.
Climbing wall and caving experience	£3,745	All children were able to try climbing and caving, to some this was a new skill that had not been used beforehand.
